Why should I get certified?

- Demand for multifamily energy audits is on the rise in Pennsylvania & there is a shortage of certified energy auditors to do the work.
- Pennsylvania's electric companies are offering rebates for energy efficiency improvements, making it cheaper for building owners to make improvements.
- Getting BPI certified distinguishes you from competitors and helps to make you an attractive candidate for employers.



What will I learn from the course?

This BPI Multifamily Building Analyst training course teaches energy auditing requirements for multifamily housing. Students will learn building science fundamentals and how to apply these skills to multifamily rental housing such as apartment complexes, townhouses, or condominiums.

Are there prerequisites?

BPI Building Analyst Certification or experience with Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) systems and their operations is strongly recommended prior to seeking BPI Multifamily Building Analyst certification.

What is the format of the course?

Students will receive four days of combined classroom and practical training. The BPI Multifamily Building Analyst Certification exam will be given on the 5th day of the course. This certification exam will consist of a multiple choice written test followed by a practical, picture-based multiple choice test.
